### Possible characters

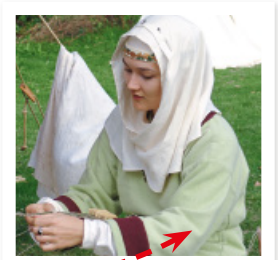
<p><b>Celtic Britain</b></p> <p><i>Boudicca, a famous Celt ▶</i></p> <p><b>a druid</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Druids were religious leaders.</li> <li>- They were responsible<sup>1</sup> for rites<sup>2</sup> and sacrifices<sup>3</sup>.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p><b>Boudicca</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- She was the leader of the Iceni tribe and fought against the Romans.</li> <li>- She died in the year 60 AD or 61 AD.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Roman Britain</b></p> <p><b>a soldier</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Only men over 20 could become Roman soldiers.</li> <li>- They were very tough<sup>4</sup> and their leaders were very strict<sup>5</sup>.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p><b>a child</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Rich families sent their boys to school or had a private teacher.</li> <li>- Girls could get married from the age of 12 and boys from age 14.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Norman Britain</b></p> <p><i>William the Conqueror ▶</i></p> <p><b>a rich person</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The Norman lords didn't speak English.</li> <li>- They lived in castles and often had huge feasts<sup>6</sup> there.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p><b>a poor person</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Most people in Norman Britain were poor.</li> <li>- They lived in simple huts<sup>7</sup> and worked very hard for their lords.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Tudor Britain</b></p> <p><b>a sailor</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Life at sea was exciting, but also very dangerous and tough.</li> <li>- Usually there wasn't any fresh food on the ships, so many sailors didn't get enough vitamins and became sick.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p><b>a farmer</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Most people were farmers in small villages.</li> <li>- The work was hard and started very early in the morning.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Victorian Britain</b></p> <p><i>A Victorian lady and her butler ▶</i></p> <p><b>a servant</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Rich Victorian families often had a number of servants<sup>8</sup> like cooks, nannies<sup>9</sup> or butlers.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p><b>a factory worker</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Victorian factories were loud, dark and dirty. People had to work long hours and child labour<sup>10</sup> was very common.</li> </ul>

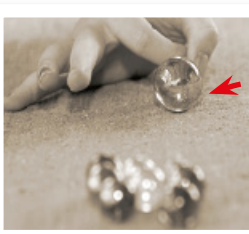
