

The history of Hollywood

1 Hollywood is full of movie studios and theaters and it's where all the famous stars live. Millions of tourists go to Hollywood every year, over 5,000 every day. They visit movie studios and hope to see their favorite star somewhere on the streets. But how did Hollywood become so famous? About a hundred years ago the USA became richer and richer. People had more money than ever before and wanted to spend it in their free time. Going to the movies became almost everyone's favorite hobby! In the 1920s movies were still silent, but after 1927 there were more and more movies with sound. A lot of movie studios moved to Hollywood because of the dry, warm weather, which made it easier to film outdoors. The Hollywood sign has been there since 1923.
